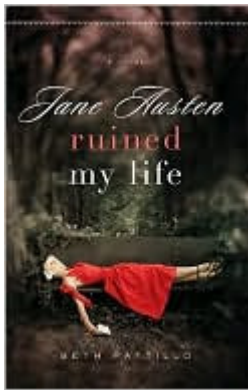

Detective Maisie Dobbs, in her fourth appearance in this delightful and popular series, must catch a madman before he commits murder on an unimaginable scale.

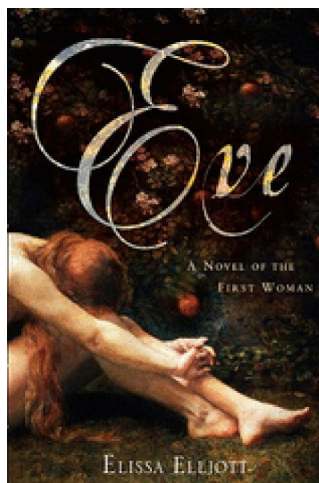
