Have you stopped by the new Teen Center yet?

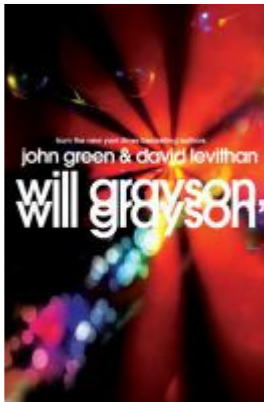

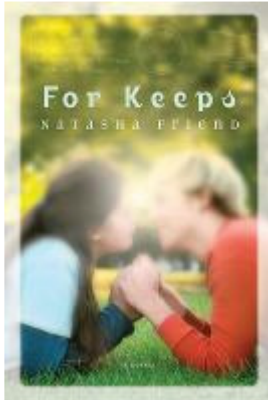
[Mercury](#) - Hope Larson

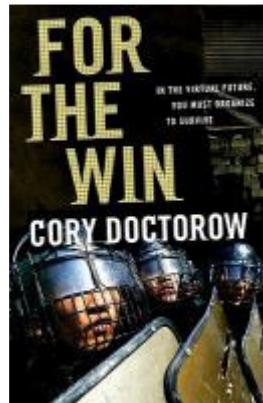

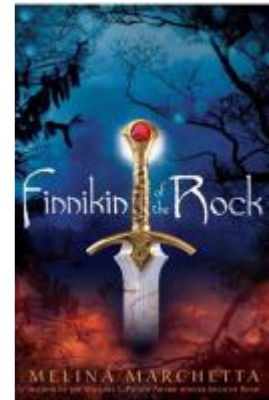
