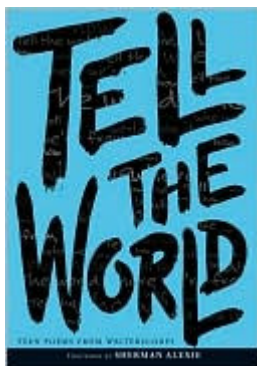

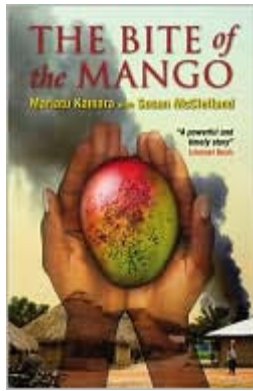

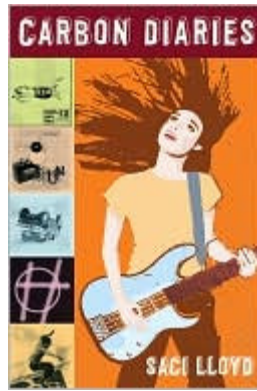


**The Bite of the Mango**
