[The New England Sports Museum](#) houses one of the finest collections of sports artifacts, artwork, media, and photography in North America. Included in the collections are a nineteenth century women's basketball uniform, four decades of memorabilia from U.S. Olympic medal winning hockey, souvenirs from fifty years of Celtics tradition, and eighty years of Boston Bruins memories.

Exhibits celebrate a century of Red Sox baseball

and the New England Patriots championship seasons as well as the Special Olympics, amateur, and college sports.

Pass admits up to 6 people per visit, free of charge. Pass must be returned.
